

Crosspoint Clubhouse
COVID-19 Handbook Addendum
2021-2022

Crosspoint Clubhouse is continually keeping an eye on COVID regulations from the Texas Health and Human Services and the CDC recommendations. Please know that our top priority is children's safety.

Drop off/Pick UP

- We will not be conducting temperature screenings at the door
- Sign in/sign out will be done by the teachers through the Procare App
- NO toys are allowed from home
- Each person must drop off and then promptly leave the building. For everyone's safety, congregating or lingering at the classroom or hallway will not be allowed during this time. Thank you in advance for making sure to clear the building promptly, allowing for social distancing.

Face Coverings

- Children will not be required to wear face masks. Children two and under are NOT permitted to wear them at all due to the danger of suffocation.
- Masks are optional for staff and parents entering the building.

Screenings/Illness

*It is imperative that sick children staff and teachers stay home when not feeling well. Crosspoint Clubhouse asks that parents take their child's temperature each morning and self screen them. Any sign of runny nose, cough, flushed cheeks and overall temperament change-SHOULD stay home. In order to keep Crosspoint Clubhouse and its families safe, we must be diligent in making sure children are completely healthy when present and sending children home at the first sign of illness.

*Every morning each staff member, teacher and child will be scanned for illness. If there is any sign of illness, the staff member, teacher and/or child will be asked to leave.

*Any staff member, teacher, parent and/or child with a temperature of 100.4 will not be allowed to enter the building.

*If a child is sent home with a temperature, they are required to stay home for 3 days FEVER free WITHOUT use of medication, or get a doctor's note stating they are safe to return to preschool.

COVID diagnosis

If COVID-19 is lab confirmed in a staff member, teacher or child:

-Crosspoint Clubhouse must contact the local health authority to report the presence of COVID-19. The health authority will instruct Crosspoint Clubhouse on what must be done within the classroom/building/and with staff and teachers.

-Crosspoint Clubhouse then must contact its state licensing representative to report the presence of COVID-19.

-Crosspoint Clubhouse will treat COVID-19 as other communicable diseases and inform parents in writing when a student has tested positive in their classroom.

-If a family member at the house tests positive for COVID we ask that you follow your doctor recommendations on quarantining for your child at Crosspoint Clubhouse.

Other

-Crosspoint Clubhouse is not requiring staff to be vaccinated. Due to federal HIPPA laws, staff members do not have to share whether they are vaccinated or not.
